Saskatchewan Polytechnic begins phased return to classes Thursday, November 5

November 4, 2020 – Saskatchewan Polytechnic is introducing a phased return to classes starting tomorrow, November 5. Students in some scheduled in-person training will resume on campus starting Thursday, November 5. With the exception of the LINC program on November 5, online classes, including zoom classes, are cancelled Thursday, November 5 and Friday, November 6.

“We are beginning a phased approach to resuming in-person learning. Out of an abundance of caution we have made the decision to continue to hold on resuming online classes. I am proud to be part of this community in these extraordinary times.”
